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


# The Power of Tax Deferral

Rolling a lump-sum distribution into a traditional IRA offers a key benefit: tax deferral. This means you don't pay taxes on the assets in your IRA until you withdraw them.

If you roll the distribution to a taxable account rather than a tax-deferred IRA, you will owe ordinary income taxes on the distribution amount. If you are under age  $59\frac{1}{2}$ , you may also owe a 10% early withdrawal penalty.

Consider the difference tax deferral can make in the growth of a \$10,000 lump-sum distribution over time. The longer you can delay paying taxes, the better the potential to accumulate more retirement savings.
