Great News for 2008



Although the media forecasted a bleak economy for 2008, businesses in OB don't seem to notice. So far, the new year marks expansion and growth along Newport Ave. and Santa Monica: Clothing boutique, Closet, opened its largest location at 4878 Newport. (Their smaller store in the 4900 block will operate as an outlet store until the lease runs out.) The 4900 block underwent major changes as Cottage Antiques moved across the street and Belle Maison, an interior design firm, re-opened its doors on the corner of Newport and Cable.

Roots, the kind food restaurant at 4976 Newport, will appear in the first edition of Edible San Diego, a new publication dedicated to connecting conscious consumers with local, healthful food. "We're honored, and very excited about it," said Roots co-owner Heather Weightman. Additionally, a new location of Café Bella and OB Quik is set to open soon. This 'onestop-shop' will serve sandwiches, coffee, and ice cream alongside a convenience store at 4821 Newport Ave. On Santa Monica Ave., another kind of one-stop-shop is in the making: as of February 1, Saffran Packaging and Blue Frog welcome Copy Hut into its location. The three businesses will join to make the Ocean Beach Business Center. "We're dedicated to becoming a community business," said Mike Saffran, owner. "We welcome community input since we want to give people what they need." A couple doors up the same street, Sunset Cliffs Body Therapies, a family-owned massage service, graduated from doing house calls to offering expanded services at their new location at 4870 Santa Monica, Suite 2C (upstairs).

These are just some of the exciting things happening in our community. Despite the forecasts . . . 2008 is a great year for Ocean Beach.

CANDIDATE PETITIONS FOR OCEAN BEACH PLANNING BOARD'S ANNUAL ELECTION ARE NOW AVAILABLE - DEADLINE FEB. 10TH

The Ocean Beach Planning Board will conduct its annual election on Tuesday, March 11, 2008 from 4 pm to 7 pm at the Ocean Beach Recreation Center at 4726 Santa Monica Avenue in Ocean Beach. Candidate petitions may be obtained from the Ocean Beach Planning Board secretary, Shane Finneran, by calling 619-405-7053 or e-mailing shane.finneran@gmail.com. All candidate-nomination petitions must be submitted by February 10, 2008.

Candidates for election must present to the Board a nominating petition signed by at least 35 electors of the District in which he/she desires to run, must be least eighteen (18) years of age, and meet at least one of the following criteria

- 1. Has been a resident of the District for at least thirty (30) consecutive days.
- 2. Is the owner of real property situated in the District for at least thirty (30) consecutive days.
- 3. Is a business person with a business address in the District at which employees or operators of the business are located for more than thirty (30) days?

Electors may also place advisory propositions upon the election ballot by submitting a "qualified" proposition petition at a Board meeting. To be qualified, the proposition must be verified by the Secretary as having been signed by 250 electors within the Ocean Beach planning area.

The Ocean Beach planning area is bounded to the east and south by the middle of Seaside Street from Nimitz Boulevard to Greene Street, the middle of Greene Street from Seaside Street to Froude Street, the middle of Froude Street from Greene Street to Adair Street, the middle of Adair Street from Froude Street to the Pacific Ocean and extending seaward to the City limits. The boundary to the north and east includes the south jetty of the San Diego River to the northward extension of the Famosa Slough Channel Preserve, and south to West Point Loma Boulevard, and the middle of West Point Loma Boulevard to Seaside Street. The planning area is divided into seven districts for purposes of representation; each district is to be represented by two Board members. Copies of the map of the planning area are available from the Board secretary, Shane Finneran.

RECYCLING IS MANDATORY - BUSINESSES HAVE UNTIL FEB. 11, 2008 TO COMPLY

As of January 1, residents, businesses, and special events in San Diego are required to recycle in order to extend the life of the Miramar Landfill, estimated to close in 2012.

While the City provides residents with recycle bins, businesses and special events must fend for themselves, and have until February 11 to comply with this new law or face heavy fines. The private sector, however, offers
