GET OUT AND VOTE

The OB Planning Board wanted us to let you know that the Ocean Beach Planning Board Elections will take place Tuesday, March 10th, 2009, from 4:00pm to 7:30pm, at the Ocean Beach Recreation Center, 4726 Santa Monica Avenue. Eligible voters must be 18 years of age and are entitled to vote in their district if meeting one of the following criteria: legal resident of at least 30 days, a property owner or a business licensee. If a community member meets more than one criteria or meets a single criteria multiple times, he/she shall be limited to a single vote in a single district. If a business license is in the form of a corporation, partnership or LLC, only one vote per entity shall be allowed. All eligible voters are entitled to a single vote on election propositions, regardless of eligible district.

To vote an individual MUST present legal photo identification, AND (if this photo identification does not prove legal 30-day residency within current district), documentation proving residency, property ownership, or business ownership within the Ocean Beach Planning Board district, with NO exceptions. Acceptable photo identification can be in the form of a driver's license, state identification card, passport or military ID. Acceptable documentation can be in the form of a utility bill, tax bill, business license, or rent receipt that has the individual's name and street address. Photocopies of documents proving business or property ownership are acceptable. Business cards or photocopies of photo identification will not be accepted. Visit www.obpb.org for more information.

IRS - Standard Mileage Rates

The Internal Revenue Service issued the 2009 optional standard mileage rates used to calculate the deductible costs of operating an automobile for business, charitable, medical or moving purposes. Beginning on Jan. 1, 2009, the standard mileage rates for the use of a car (also vans, pickups or panel trucks) will be:

- 55 cents per mile for business miles driven
- 24 cents per mile driven for medical or moving purposes
- 14 cents per mile driven in service or charitable organization.

Inserted in your newsletter is the 2009 Police authorization Form. Please fill this out and follow the directions to return the form to us and the police. When you fill out this form, it gives the police the right to walk onto your property and remove vagrants from your property. Without this form, the Police will not enter your property without you being present. Often at night or in the early morning hours, there is unwanted activity in store setbacks and behind businesses. If this activity is reported to the Police, the Police can't act unless this form is on file with SDPD Western Division.
