The Great Flood of January 2010!

Last week's rainstorm wreaked havoc on the business district of Ocean Beach. The storms started with a force Monday afternoon January 18 and seemed to continue. Despite valiant efforts of sandbag fortresses all



over town, some storefronts (including our own OBMA office) found themselves drenched by Monday night and continued to deal with the damage for days.

As for the OBMA office, the staff cleared out early Monday afternoon, secured the front door with sandbags up to 3 high, and hoped for the best. Although our door stayed dry throughout Monday's storm, the walls failed to sustain the onslaught that raged down Bacon St.: by Tuesday morning the front part of the OBMA office filled with flood water (seeped through the front walls) and sustained major damage.

As if partial damage wasn't enough, the other half of the office sustained further flooding Tuesday night through the side wall adjacent to the alley. The staff operated as best it could. As of Monday, Jan. 25th we were under construction to fix the damaged areas. We hope all the storefronts got through this rough patch and sustained as little interruption of business as possible. As for the OBMA, we continue to do our best to keep everyone informed.
