IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR MERCHANTS

What do you do when transients are hanging around your property, bothering you or your customers, causing problems or breaking the law?

If it is a non-emergency you must call 619-531-2000 immediately and stay on the phone until you talk to the operator. It is so important that you do this. Police staffing in our area is based on the

number of calls the police receive when you call 911 for emergencies or 531-2000 for non-emergencies. It may be frustrating when it takes a long time to actually talk to someone but it is essential. Also, please feel free to contact our office at 224-4906 with your complaints as we keep a log of all complaint calls we receive.

Never approach someone who is acting oddly. Let the Police handle it. If a crime has been committed, please make notes with as much information as possible. The more help we give the SDPD, the better for us all. We have inserted the Police Authorization Form once again (it allows the police to go on to your property to deal with problems) for you to sign and fax to us at 619-224-4976 or drop it off.



INNOVATIVE LIGHTING ILLUMINATES OB HOTEL!

According to owner Rich Grosch, the Ocean Beach Hotel looks a lot brighter along Newport Avenue due to an impressive array of lighting that now illuminates the walls, flowers, and sidewalk along an over 150 ft. stretch of the street. The brainchild of Kevin Godowski, chief engineer at the hotel and founder of Lost Photon Electronics, these lights not only light up the wall, but also provide theater type lighting for the sidewalk. "Because they are computer controlled, we can control any color combination and any arrangement we want" according to Kevin. "So let's say it is Fourth of July we can have red, white and blue, or Halloween can be orange." Not only do the lights provide a beautiful improvement to the hotel and the wall, but also adds safety and security to the area. The theater type lighting of the sidewalk aids pedestrians and illuminates a once dark area of the street.

But the real innovation is that these are not lights at all in the

strict sense. They are LED, which stands for light emitting diodes. These tiny emitters give off extremely bright light, however they use very little electricity. In fact, to illuminate over 150 ft of wall uses less than 4.5 amps of electricity, the equivalent to powering a small (15 inch) flat screen monitor. That includes the computer that controls the lights. And, they use twelve volts, the same as a car battery. Future plans call for these lights to be connected to photovoltaic panels on the roof of the hotel that will take them completely off the grid. Kevin is not new to LED lights or new innovations. He is an impressive, cutting edge inventor as well. In addition to this project for the hotel, his latest invention is a line of skateboards that use LED to light up the board and can be recharged using your home computer. His company is called Lost Photon Electronics and can be found on the web at: www.lostphoton.com
