
Going green for St. Patty's Day usually means green beer and getting pinched for not following ancient tradition. In this

As economic times grow more uncertain, many of us find ourselves tightening budgets and rethinking how to do business. Going green and improving the environment may not seem like an enormous money-saver, but some tips (and examples) of local businesses (and consumers) going green include:

- Coffee cups: although many restaurants and coffee shops in OB use biodegradable or reusable materials in their cups and to go packaging, get in the habit of using a travel mug so those materials don't go to the landfill in the first place.
- Damaged or unsold inventory: Recycle it! Don't toss your unsolds and buy new right away. Look around your store and see what of your inventory could use some 'new life', and get creative! For example

- Lighting: use low-energy LED lights for your displays. They're pretty and consume way less of your electric bill.
- Packing materials: most of us know this one but it's worth the repeat. Take your leftover packing materials (peanuts, Styrofoam, etc...) to Saffran Packaging at 4876 Santa Monica. They get reused and are much appreciated!
- Recycling: DO IT! The City of San Diego won't provide recycle bins to businesses, but businesses can pool resources and rent a common dumpster from a private recycle center. (Refer to the 'Info for Members' page on oceanbeachsandiego.com for recycling resources.)
- Used grocerybags: either take them to OB Paint and Hardware, 4871 Newport Ave., (they reuse them) or contribute them to the many poop bag bins around the neighborhood. If you don't have one on your block by all means create one. Unclaimed dog poop wreaks havoc on our drainage systems and our ocean (not to mention the bottoms of our shoes).

Smart meters set the stage for energy savings and improved service.

You'll soon have a new tool that can help you gain better control of your energy use and costs. SDG&E[®] will replace 1.4 million electric meters with smart meters and upgrade 900,000 natural gas meters from March 2009 to December 2011. SDG&E's smart-meter initiative is part of California's Energy Action Plan, a statewide roadmap for achieving a reliable, affordable and sustainable energy future.

Smart meters are digital devices that collect and communicate your energy-use data regularly throughout the day to SDG&E. Eventually, you'll be able to monitor your energy use daily via the Internet instead of waiting for a monthly recap on your bill. You'll be able to track your home energy use hourly and business energy use every 15 minutes. Knowing when you use energy can help you save it, which also helps the environment by preserving natural resources.

"We're using smart-meter technology to develop improved service options for customers, including new ways to save energy, save money and add convenience to everyday life," says Debra Reed, SDG&E president and chief executive officer. "In the future, for example, smart meters may allow you to earn bill credits for conserving power at peak-use times."

Smart meters already serve about 7,200 large businesses in SDG&E's service area. To prepare for installations region-wide, SDG&E tested the smart-meter technology at selected homes and businesses in the Tierrasanta community last year.
