In a record turnout Thursday, October 23<sup>rd</sup>, the **Ocean Beach MainStreet Association** marked its Annual Awards Night and 30<sup>th</sup> Birthday Celebration. Over 160 people enjoyed the evening that was sponsored by Union Bank.


